
## Funding Restriction Impact: Due to budget restrictions the total program award for FY15 was reduced nearly 60% (from FY14).

- Companies were forced to reduce their training budgets
- Training was delayed or cancelled resulting in stagnant business and employee development
- Lack of training funds has stopped the learning progress and hinders training already started. Efficiency gains are fading.
- New product start-ups were delayed due to training not being available
- Job creation was postponed or cancelled as a result of not having training funds to train the new hires



- New equipment purchases were delayed or reduced with no training funds to train workers on the new equipment
- Lost profitability resulting from being unable to provide employees with quality, supervisory, and equipment specific training
- Less employee promotions and higher turnover resulting from lack of training
- Employees working overtime to make up for the lack of knowledge and training short fall
- Unable to hire appropriate trainers to keep employees up to date on technology changes

WIA funding is statutorily limited to training and employment services <u>for individual job seekers</u> that meet strict eligibility requirements, i.e., economically disadvantaged adults, dislocated/laid off workers.
